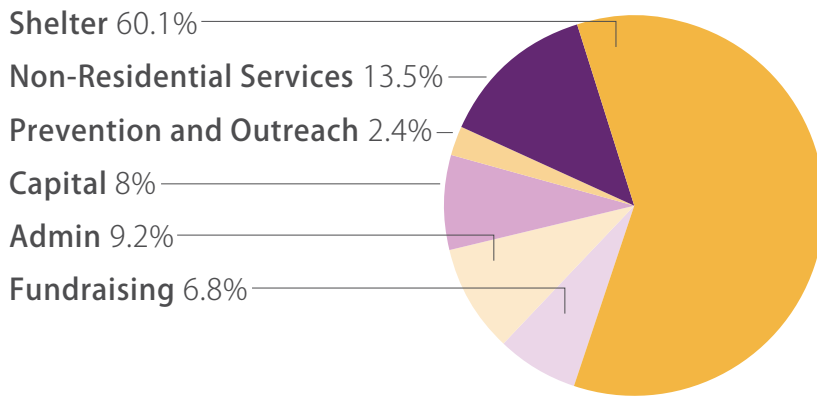

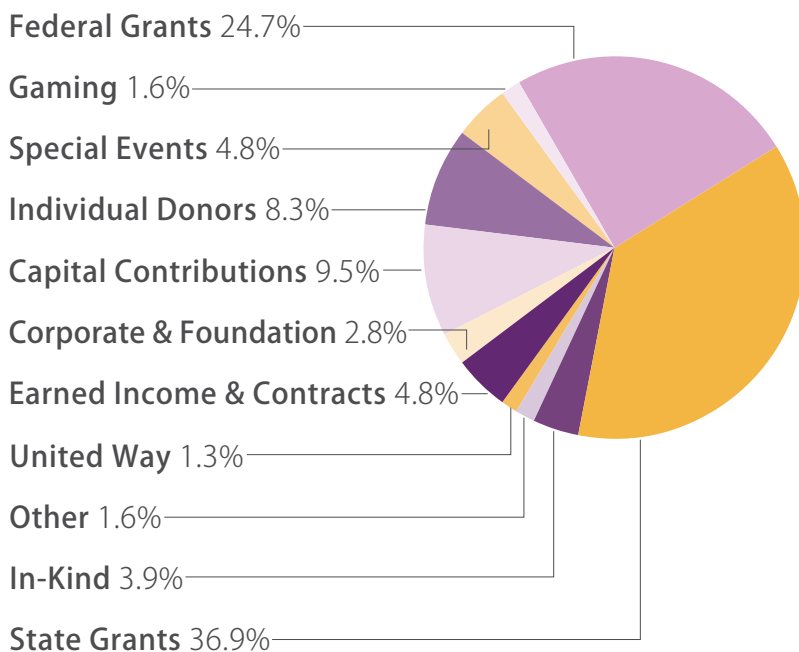
AWAIC provides domestic violence safe shelter, intervention, and prevention.

Fiscal Year 2019 Impact

SHELTER AND SAFE HOUSING SERVICES

- 22,109 shelter safe nights were provided to 408 women and men and 223 children at imminent risk due to domestic violence.
- 30 days is the average length of stay for women and children in the Shelter.
- 17 women stayed at Harmony House, a 10-bed transitional living facility for women without dependent children.
- 7,544 crisis and support calls were answered by AWAIC staff.

PREVENTION AND EDUCATION

AWAIC staff provided:

- 201 presentations to 5,995 youth in the community
- 18 trainings to 598 professionals
- 51 community presentations to 2,332 community members

NON-RESIDENTIAL SERVICES

- 335 nonresidential women and children at risk for domestic violence were assisted by AWAIC staff.
- 57 adults and children achieved safe, permanent housing through the Moving Forward Program which provides case management and support to those experiencing homelessness as a result of domestic violence.
- 471 men and women received Legal Advocacy Services including information, referrals, assistance with protective orders, safety planning, and court accompaniment.
- 120 men and women received financial assistance and relocation services through the Alaska Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Intervention Project (ADVSAIP).

SAFE SPACES EXPANSION & RENOVATION PROJECT

This was an exciting year for AWAIC as we strived to achieve the \$4.6 million goal for our Safe Spaces Expansion and Renovation Project. Safe Spaces will provide an additional 15 beds and more programmatic space for our nonresidential programs. This project is expected to be completed by Fall 2020 and will enhance our ability to support victims of domestic violence.
